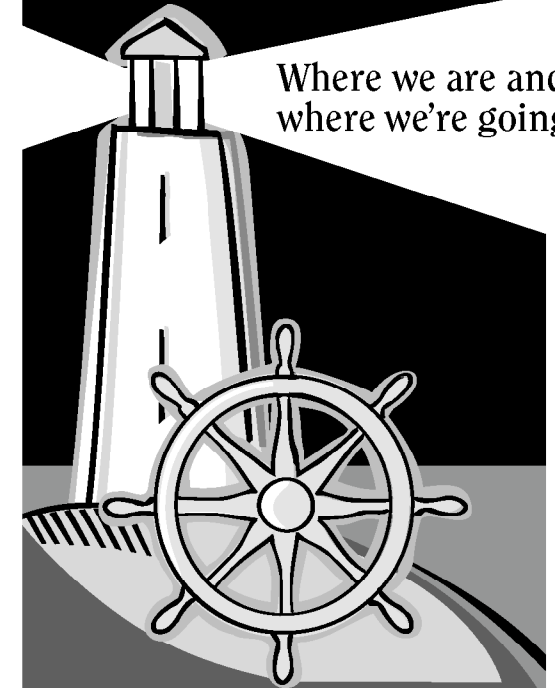

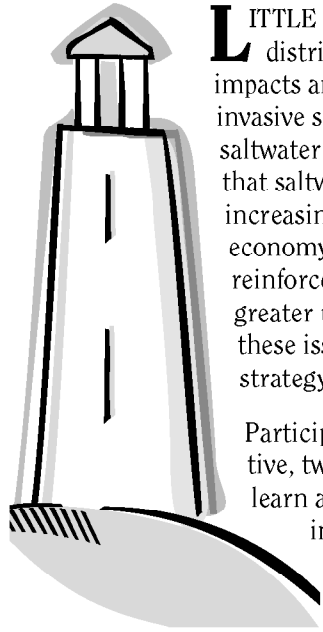


Invasive Species in Florida's Saltwater Systems:

LITTLE IS KNOWN about the distribution, behavior, impacts and management of invasive species in Florida's saltwater ecosystems. Evidence that saltwater invaders pose an increasing threat to the state's economy and environment reinforces the need for both a greater understanding of these issues and a cooperative strategy for addressing them.

Participants in this interactive, two-day workshop will learn about the status of invasive species

research, outreach and management from national and

statewide perspectives. Primary goals of the workshop are to identify key challenges to effective management of saltwater invasives and to initiate development of a strategic plan to guide future research and education efforts in Florida.
